

Saturday, April 18, 2015, 9 AM to 4 PM

In April the LVAGO will be journeying to the Lansdale/Souderton area to hear and play three very different tracker pipe organs. St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Church has been the home of a Durner (II/10) since 1901. It was recently restored by Patrick J. Murphy and Associates, Inc. In Lansdale, we will visit the large 1997 Martin Ott (3/69). The organ enjoys an ideal location on the central axis of the sanctuary of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. Intentionally located off of any axis is the 1969 C. B. Fisk (II/21) in Zion Mennonite Church in Souderton. This modest organ is a joy to play and more versatile than one would suspect from the small stop list.

The day will also include a welcome lunch break. More details will follow in the April newsletter. Drew Long is the coordinator for the event.
