
### May 6, 2016 Organ Crawl to NE PA

Following a revised format (with a later start time), it was a day filled with five workshop sessions featuring a variety of topics, plus a Festive closing celebration with choral, concertato, and organ arrangements by California based composer Craig Phillips. Each time slot had 2–4 workshop choices, from reading sessions to rehearsal techniques to historical seminars. *Greatest Lutheran Hits* by Michael Krentz was especially interesting, where we learned about the historical significance of several German Lutheran chorales.

There was a longer break for lunch, which allowed more time for socializing and music shopping. I always enjoy the organ music exchange table, where I pick up lots of books to try at home. Sadly, I did not see many LVAGO members in attendance, but am thankful for all

those who did attend. I am hoping we can have better representation next year.


