April Meeting Report



Organ crawl participants at St. John's Lutheran, Easton

Saturday, April 21 was a perfect day; with clear, warm spring weather; to explore some of our local area pipe organs. On that day organ crawl participants got to play and hear three "hidden gems" and one pipe organ well known to local audiences.

The day began at St. John's Lutheran Church, Easton where our host was church member, Jim Van Horn. The organ is a 1967 II/14 Walcker tracker that the church purchased in the early nineties and thoroughly refurbished at the time. A particular delight to play, the action is light and responsive.

Our second stop was St. Thomas UCC in Bethlehem, home to a 1993 II/23 Schantz organ. Host Christopher Malocheski provided a demonstration of the organ as well as a sideshow displaying pictures of the organ's interior and a printed detailed stoplist. Warm sounds emanate from behind a handsome, imposing façade.

After a lunch break, we headed for Saints Simon and Jude in Bethlehem which features a 1977 II/23 Casavant. Though of modest size and stock design, this organ acquits itself very well in the gracious acoustic of the nave. Our host was Jean Cunningham.

The last stop for the day was at St. John's Lutheran Church to us. The 1993 IV/87 Reuter is well know to most of us. This was a chance to actually play it! Host, Eric Gombert helped the participants navigate the huge console with registration assistance.

A Workshop in Allentown, PA, June 16, 2018



The Association of Lutheran Church Musicians is sponsoring a workshop for parish musicians, pastors, and others interested in worship and worship planning on Saturday, June 16, 2018, from 9:30 am to 3:30 pm. The workshop will take place at Christ Lutheran Church, 1245 Hamilton Street, Allentown; it will explore the Psalms and their use in Christian worship.
