

I hope everyone had a good Christmas season! I'm sure a lot of us are already looking at Lent and Easter music. The slight lull right now is a good time to look for new music, work on new pieces, plan new things. It's usually about this time that I go through my "bucket list" of pieces and decide what new things I might work on. Doing that always brings back my enthusiasm after a demanding Christmas season.



I've always loved the feeling of "newness" that

comes with the beginning of another year. When I was a kid, my dad had built a greenhouse for starting plants for our rather large vegetable garden. We grew all our own vegetables. And one of my favorite things about the process was when my dad would start up the greenhouse in late January for the upcoming year. I loved to sit in the heated greenhouse while it was cold and maybe snowy outside, watching the tiny plants and imagining how they'd grow, what they'd become, etc.

It has been many years since my dad's greenhouse was operating, but nowadays there are all kinds of grow lights and plant growing systems. I

bought a few small hydroponic countertop gardens this year, and I have rekindled that joy of watching seeds sprout and seeing plants develop during the dead of winter. Doing that reminds me of the joy of looking at and working on new organ pieces. I see some similarity in the two processes. With music, we bring the music notation to life. We water our pieces with our practice, and we fertilize them with our study of how to interpret them. And hopefully our results have some things in common: we produce "living" music for others to enjoy, and hopefully we grow as people in the process.

So the time is here to look through our seed catalogs (or look through our stack of music we hope to learn.) Daydream of the gardens you could grow (or the music you could play). I find in a given year that I can't grow all the things I'd like to, nor can I learn all the pieces I'd like, but the daydreaming is so important for motivation, both in the plant world and the music world! Keep those daydreams alive! Work on bringing some of them to life each year!
