Notes from the Dean

Dear Colleagues,

Greetings from your Officers and Executive Board! We've been enthusiastically planning another year of interesting and educational events, with ample opportunities for fun and fellowship. See some intriguing peeks into the coming attractions, courtesy of our Sub-Dean, Janice Butz, in this issue...

In June your Lehigh Valley Chapter officers and board invited the Reading Chapter to meet with us. Unfortunately they have been experiencing severely declining membership and lack of participation for several years. I would like to share with you the results of that joint meeting. The following members of the Reading Chapter met with the Lehigh Valley officers and executive board on July 22, 2025: Dean Joyce Maurer, Sub-Dean Joanne Lutz, Secretary Carla Bell, Treasurer John Brewster, members Matt Wary and Tom Busteed. The Reading Chapter includes Schuylkill and is down to about twenty members, most of whom are semi-retired and don't drive at night. Many of their members are juggling serving multiple churches because of a shortage of organists. Many churches have either closed, or now use guitars to lead worship, meaning fewer organists are attracted to the area. The same six or eight members plan/attend chapter events. The Reading Chapter's most successful projects have been Pedals, Pipes and Pizza every three years, annual members' recitals, and their yearly scholarship program funded by those members' recitals and administered by the Reading Music Foundation. After an honest and lengthy discussion, the Reading Chapter proposed a sort of "trial marriage" for our 2025-2026 program year, during which we will include them in our programs and communications, and schedule one of our events geographically closer to them. At the end of the year we will meet together again to evaluate the possibility of absorbing Reading into our chapter. Of course, we would need to go through national approval and procedure. Please keep the Reading Chapter as well as the Lehigh Valley Chapter in your prayers, as together we face challenging decisions about the future.

Meet Our New Members

Melinda Kelly is a graduate of Lebanon Valley College and holds a Music Education degree, majoring in voice, minoring in piano. After graduation, she studied organ with Corinne Eckert, Grace Lutheran Church, Shillington, PA, and Thomas Nase, First Presbyterian Church, Reading, PA. Six months after beginning organ studies, she was offered the position as Organist/Choir Director at her home Church, St. John's Lutheran, Gibraltar, PA, remaining there for two years. Following that, Melinda became Director of Music at Calvary Lutheran Church in Laureldale, PA for 32 years. During her time there, she reports, "we installed a three manual, 38 rank Schantz organ, which was 'heavenly'!" Melinda has also taught General and Vocal Music at Boyertown Area School District, at both the Elementary and Junior High and levels. In the past she has been a member of the Reading Chapter AGO since the mid-1980's, during which her church hosted a Hymn Festival with area vocal choirs, hand bell choirs and brass ensemble. In 1996 they hosted a recital celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the AGO. Presently Melinda serves Jacob's Church, Jacksonville (New Tripoli area), as Organist/ Choir Director (since November 2023). She confesses, "I thought that I had 'retired' from church music, but the Lord had other plans for me, and I am so delighted to be playing and directing again!" So are we, Melinda - so are we! Welcome to the Lehigh Valley Chapter!

Sarah Fabian had been playing the violin for many years, but when her church, Holy Family Catholic Church in Nazareth, was in need of an organist, she began teaching herself how to play the organ. Later she took the position as Music Director at St. Rocco's Catholic Church in Martin's Creek and began officially studying the organ with our chapter's sub-dean, Janice Butz. After graduating from Nazareth Area High School in 2023, she began her studies at Moravian University where she currently is a student of Barbara Thomson. Continuing her responsibilities at St. Rocco's Church and starting her junior year at Moravian, Sarah

has a busy schedule with piano, organ, violin, and Celtic fiddle lessons. In addition, she participates in chamber strings as well as numerous vocal choirs at the University. Outside of her student life, she is often found playing her violin at nursing homes and this past summer performed at DeSales University for the Pennsylvania Shakespeare Festival's outdoor entertainment "On the Green." She continues to also be involved with the music ministry at the Cathedral Church of Saint Catherine of Siena in Allentown where she at times plays her violin and sings with the Diocesan choir and Angelorum, the women's choir. Sarah looks forward to playing her junior organ recital this coming academic year, as well as eventually pursuing the American Guild of Organist's Service Playing Certificate.



Sacred Voices Annual Concert

Sacred Voices, a fifty-six voice unauditioned summer choir directed by founder Susan L. Frickert, will present its yearly concert on Sunday, September 28 at 4:00 p.m. at Union Lutheran Church, 5500 Route 873, Schnecksville, PA 18078. This year's theme, "Get On Board, Little Children - African-American Spirituals", features a variety of familiar and not so familiar spirituals from the rich cultural legacy of enslaved Africans, which grew into the uniquely American music forms we know and love as Blues, Jazz, Rock and Roll, and Gospel. Included are fresh arrangements by black composers such as Moses Hogan, Andre Thomas, Undine Smith-Moore, Stacy Gibbs, Eurydice Osterman, Rollo Dillworth, and Victor Johnson. Featured guest vocal soloist, Evelyn Stewart, is well-known to music circles in the Lehigh Valley. She will be the highlight of many of the choral pieces, as well as perform two spirituals by herself. Susan Frickert will perform an Organ Toccata based on "Lift Every Voice and Sing" by composer Mark Miller.
