

Reflections from AGO San Francisco 2024

From June 30 to July 4 I had the pleasure of attending the 2024 AGO National Convention held in San Francisco. It was a whirlwind five days being in beautiful sacred spaces, hearing fabulous organists in recital, listening to newly commissioned works, participating in informative workshops, and perusing displays from vendors and publishers of all things related to the organ. As you can see from the photo of the Fratelli Ruffatti organ at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption in San Francisco, the instruments I heard were not only capable of magnificent sounds, but were visually unique and stunning. Altogether there were 25 venues where recitals were performed, 55 workshops on a variety of topics, and several optional walking tours of this vibrant city. In addition to recitals, worship services took place, ranging from the opening service in the Reformed Jewish tradition at San Francisco's historic Congregation Sherith Israel to a rousing and uplifting African-American service at the Third Baptist Church where the Bay Area Inspirational Choir shared jubilant music in both classical and gospel styles.

The days were long, with workshops held in the numerous meeting rooms of the hotel each morning. I especially enjoyed Robert McCormick's sessions on *Improvisation for Everyone* and Katelyn Emerson's practical workshop on *Deliberate Practice* for the mind and body of the organist. In the afternoon a multitude of buses would transport the 1,000 or more attendees throughout the city of San Francisco and beyond. Memorable performances included a wonderful concert by the vocal ensemble Chanticleer and hearing Kimberly Marshall play the Murray Harris organ and the Fisk tracker organ, both situated in the balcony of the chapel at Stanford University. After dinner we again hopped on the buses to travel to an evening concert. Perhaps the most inspiring event was the recital by Faythe Freese at Grace Cathedral which was programmed Pipes and Pageantry; Dance and Delight, pairing virtuosic music for the organ with lighting effects on the interior walls of the cathedral, a live dance troupe, and video projections of contemporary art. And at the end of the day, we journeyed back to the hotel for a chance to check out all the exhibits and to enjoy a social time that lasted until midnight-that is, if we still had the energy to do so!

Besides all the learning opportunities and magnificent musical performances, one of the most fun and gratifying parts of the convention was the opportunity to meet other organists, especially on those bus rides to and from the concerts. It was a time to converse and connect with fellow organists, to share our professional experiences, and to make new friends as well as catch up with old ones. It was an exhausting five days, but certainly a stimulating educational event. If you have the chance, plan to attend a future AGO convention. It's guaranteed to be a unique and memorable time!
